- 2. <u>Actual spend vs Budget</u>: Year to date spend is <u>£28.65 over budget</u>, (main driver being IT domain payment in advance).
- 3. <u>Reserves</u>: Held for the following purposes 3 month working reserve £2,700; 2019 Grant payments £1,400; Capital reserve £4,000, Hence net available for discretionary 'projects: £2,100.
- 4. <u>Section 137 Local Grants</u> The 2019/20 PC budget includes the sum of £1,400 (funds to come from PC reserves) for section 137 payments to local clubs and organisations.

The current Department of Local Communities & Local Government Section 137 expenditure limit is £8.12 per local elector in the parish, hence with Sandon having 402 registered electors this equates to £3,260 as the maximum total amount that can be awarded for 2019/20.

Last year a total of £1,400 was awarded as follows: PCC £400; FOSS £300, Gardeners C £100; Sports C £400; Cygnets £100; Herts Air Ambulance £100.

The Council should agree a strategy for this year's 137 Local Grants and decide to which, if any, organisations a letter should be sent inviting applications for grants.

5. <u>Bank Mandate changes:</u> The requested changes for the removal of retired Councillor Jayne Wharton and the addition of Councillor Keith Chamberlain as approved signatories have now been implemented by the Councils bankers Santander.
