

# **Rural Outreach Volunteer**

Time Commitment: Ad-hoc approx 4 hours a week, Flexible

Locations × 3: Villages around Royston; Ashwell and Sandon/Wallington/Rushden/Weston.

# **Context of Role:**

The Rural Outreach Project was set up to promote awareness of Citizens Advice North Hertfordshire (CANH) across our rural communities. Its aim is to ensure that those living in rural villages and hamlets know how to access our services albeit through our website, drop-in service, Adviceline and/or through community workshops and events. We are continuing to build our Rural Outreach Volunteer team to achieve this and are looking for additional volunteers to ensure coverage across the whole of rural North Hertfordshire.

### **Duties and Responsibilities:**

Flexibility is needed according to location and facilities available within each location, main tasks include:

- Forge links with local organisations, for example, parent and toddler groups, local WI, village hall groups, parish councillors, etc.
- Attend local events to talk about Citizens Advice North Herts (CANH) and explain who we are, what we do and how we can be accessed
- Arrange specific informative talks eg, Scams Awareness, Financial Capability workshops, Cost of Living support presentations, Energy Awareness etc
- In association with CANH Comms Team, access local media, for example, parish magazines, notice boards to place posters or promotional material
- Help improve our local social media presence
- Signpost clients when and where appropriate
