3 Actual spend vs Budget:

Year to date spend is within budget.

4 Section 137 spending and Local Grants:

The 2024/25 PC budget includes the sum of £1,500 (funds to come from PC reserves) for section 137 payments. The current Department of Local Communities & Local Government Section 137 expenditure limit is £10.81 per local elector in the parish, hence with Sandon having 398 registered electors this equates to £4302.38 as the maximum total amount that can be spent on community activities including grants to village clubs.

Last year a total of £1,380 was awarded as follows: PCC £800; Gardeners C £40; Cygnets £200; Herts Air Ambulance £180, Sandon Strollers £ 160 (unclaimed). The grant application form is on the PC website for all village groups to apply for.

The D-Day celebrations held in May were funded with the s.137 power which totalled £219.50, which brings our available s.137 payment authority to £4082.88

5 <u>Bank Mandate changes</u>:

No changes to be expected, former Cllr Ian Dell was not a signatory, therefore no need to update.

6 ICO – registered:

Needs renewal before 3rd October 2024

7 Parish Online:

We were eligible for this from our BHIB insurance last year and we have received an invoice for it this year separately. I was unaware of this last year and after some research into the service I believe it would be beneficial to the council in understanding who is responsible for areas of the village and will help will the Parish border questionnaire from NHDC as well as knowledge of highways responsibilities. At £48/year it is slightly over the price to apply for individual boundary confirmation from Land Registry. It also has a feature to identify where PC assets are located as well as playgrounds, defibrillators and other points of note for future clerks and councillors.
